From the Presidents' Desk

I can't believe that it is almost a year since the current committee took over our Club; it has been a full-on year well and truly. Some of the highlights for me is are: the redesign of our Club Logo to modernise and streamline the look and feel; our Founding Families Project, highlighting every land owner in the Moreton Bay District from 1860 to 1910 approx and Heritage Day, where our expertise as researchers helped to provide some fabulous information for our Heritage Day Posters that showcased the amazing early settlers to the Old Moreton Bay District; and the Moreton History Seminar which was a terrific opportunity to launch our Founding Families project and let our community know about the work we are doing for this.

This year has also seen our numbers slowly grow and we look forward to further growth in the ensuing year. I would ask anyone who may have family or friends who could be interested in researching their family history, that you offer them the opportunity to come along and see how we can help them with their research.



Our Founding Families project has really taken off. Following our Facebook posts we have had a number of people contact us about what we are doing, with offers of information about their forbears. We are so thankful for their assistance and interest in our project.

We currently have over 2,400 families have been identified as Founding Families, and this has meant that we now have hundreds of family connections via marriage. We do have a few families that have contributed to the development of Queensland within our timeframe. These early families were responsible for providing timber and produce for the fledgling colony.

Our next Founding Families Connect Event will be help over two Sunday's in May -19^{th} & 26^{th} . We are going to have it as a time-based ticketed event so that each family has time to speak with and share their information with us and we with them. We want to be able to develop solid

foundations and support from these families. If you know of anyone who would like to participate in these events, please let us know so we can give them a timeslot for one of these days.

A Founding Families Connect Newsletter will be going out very shortly and letting all the current members know that we will be showcasing more of our research at these days. We have identified over 2400 Founding Families and so the amount of research required is now quite incredible. If you are willing to help research BDM's or Trove for a couple of hours a week, then we would be grateful for the help.

As we progress with this project, it has created a great deal of interest in Family History circles around Southeast Queensland. I have spoken to a number of members of other Family History Groups and this project has piqued their interest and they have suggested that we send through more information about its' scope and progress. Over the next few months, we will hopefully be able to present some of the information and stories we have gathered for a number of Founding Families at other events and groups. If you know of any other groups who would like to hear about this project, please contact me.

14th SEPTEMBER 2024 REDCLIFFE REMEMBER

200 years of Redcliffe History.

September 2024 is set to become an exciting and interesting month for Queenslanders interested in local and family history.

A series of events is being planned to acknowledge the passing of 200 years since the brig Amity anchored just off Redcliffe Point on 12th September 1824.

The goals of the organising committee are to provide an opportunity for residents, day trippers and visitors to mark the significance of the arrival of the first European settlers to Queensland and to acknowledge the presence of the First Nations People who already inhabited this site.

The historical significance of this program is important as it will tie in with the establishment of the settlement of Brisbane in 1825. This is a great opportunity for Redcliffe's program to have a flow on effect with Brisbane's locations of significance.

Recently, there has been a resurgence of interest in local and family history, and particularly the establishment of the penal colony in 1824. We are committed to developing a high-quality program of events based on a timeline from prior to 1824 until the present day. Research has proven the importance of high-quality tourist experiences, and this week will be beneficial to local traders, tourist operators, creatives, and residents.

We also would like to hear from descendants of the soldiers, their wives and children and convicts so that we can invite them to attend a morning tea.

CFHRG will represent our Club and showcase the Founding Families Project and with as many Founding Families Connect members as possible.






No doubt there are many amongst us who have found some amazing facts about the people we research. Member Wayne Kelly discovered just this when he was researching a Kelly Ancestor from Ireland. It prompted Wayne to write the following story which he titled. "COINCIDENCE" Wayne kindly gave his permission for us to include this month's in newsletter.

"COINCIDENCE???"

How many times have you asked yourself this question when you stumbled upon something interesting and completely unexpected?

I have been researching my Kelly ancestry from Ireland and occasionally stumble on a gem or two myself. For instance, my Grandfather William Kelly 5y.o. and his sisters, Mary 8y.o. Jane 10y.o. and Sarah E. 18y.o. (20y.o. by records but she was after a husband) sailed from South Hampton 10th August 1887on the "S.S. Chyebassa" arriving in Brisbane 4th October 1887. While searching for information and a photograph of the ship I came across a copy of a diary of a passenger on one of the many voyages she made from South Hampton to Brisbane. I ordered it thinking it would give me an idea as to what life would have been like on such a voyage as my Grandfather made with his 3 sisters and no parents.

The diary was written by Allan Aitken and, <u>BY COINCIDENCE</u>, he was on my grandfather's voyage. Alan Aitken was given the paid position of constable for the voyage and, <u>BY COINCIDENCE</u>, he was in charge of women and children. He and his wife would have known my grandfather and perhaps their children played with him and his young sisters during the 54day voyage.

Further research into the ship after seeing many booklets in the Tiaro information centre put me in touch with the Maryborough Family History members. They very kindly checked the Chronicle archives and found only one entry of the "S. S. Chyebassa" visiting the area and, you guessed it, <u>BY COINCIDENCE</u>, it was dated Monday October 3, 1887. (The very ship my Grandfather was on)!

Arrivals: October 1 (at White Cliffs) "Chyebassa" B.I.S.N. Company R.N. Steamer, Captain Wilson, from London via Queensland Ports, J. Walker and Co Ltd Agents.

<u>Departures:</u> October 1 (from White Cliffs) Chyebassa B.I.S.N. Company R.N. Steamer, Captain Wilson, for Brisbane, J. Walker and Co Ltd Agents.

Upon arrival in Brisbane the children spent 3 days in immigration before they received a sponsor and, BY_COINCIDENCE, her name was Sarah Aitken. I have not proved any relationship with Allan (the author of the diary) but I have to wonder, if she was, did Allan recommend the children to her after his association with them on the voyage. (Just another notation to follow up on)

My aunty is taking a world cruise this year and the second half is London to Sydney via Suez, the way my Grandfather came, calling into the ports mentioned in Allan's diary. The time to do this leg of the journey? -- BY COINCIDENCE -- 54 days!!!
