From the Presidents' Desk

Our year has started off with great news in relation to our rental situation. The generous grant from the City of Moreton Bay to the Historical Village and its' flow on effect to us in the form of a gift of 3 years rent commencing from the 1st July 2025 until 30 June 2028 allows us to breathe a lot easier now. This "gift" will hopefully follow on from 2028 for a further 3 years provided Council don't change their mind and the Historical Village fulfill their requirements for the grant.

The Committee working on some ideas for the year that will bring a focus on our Group and its' role within the City of Moreton Bay. We will be liaising with Hayley Rowan our new Local History Leader to leverage her support of our Group with Council. We need to put CFHRG front and centre with Council as an important member of the Historical Community in the area. One of the ways we might do this is to bring together all the individual Historical Group together with Hayley and Council to meet to see if there is a way that Council can bring more support behind our Groups collectively rather than individually. This might lead to further funding opportunities and hosted events within the City of Moreton Bay.

On February 6th we held our last General Meeting, unfortunately, this meeting could not go ahead as we did not have sufficient members attend. Given this, we have set a new date for our next general meeting of Wednesday 22nd April. We need to know in advance if we have enough people attending to progress with the meeting. So please let us know when the meeting request goes out who will be attending and who will not. We really feel so disappointed that meetings are now being held every 2 months and we can't get enough people to participate.

We continue to have low numbers coming into the Club Rooms each week, but those that are coming are excited with their research and we are all learning lots from their investigations each week.

We are looking to run a morning tea for those of you who would like to know more about researching utilising Australian BDM's and the likes of Scotland's People. This will be held in a few weeks and as soon as a date is set down, we will let you all know.

CFHRG celebrates 45 years We have recently been given a large number of photographs from the family of Pat Spence, which we have now digitised and will be working through them for inclusion in any celebrations in the near future.

Website We have been updating our website with Newsletters and a couple of other pages, and this will continue to evolve over the year. If anyone has any ideas for information that could go onto the website, please let the Committee know.

Facebook Our Facebook page has 723 followers at present. Each month we have more people following our posts and this is very encouraging. Finding items to post is sometimes difficult, but overall people are interested in our posts.

Membership Our current membership is 41 with 5 life members. Our newest members are Warren Watts, Marie Simpson, Bob Marsellos, Linda & Frank Buckley. Annual membership rolls around at the end of this month, so if you intend to continue your membership, please download the Membership Renewal form from the website - www.cfhr.org and fill it out and either drop it into the Club Rooms or photograph it with your phone and send the image to the club phone no: 0468990969, alternatively you can fill out the form on the last page of the Newsletter and subsequently deposit Membership fees direct to our bank account (details are on the Membership Renewal form).

Fundraising Effort to fundraise will still be required throughout the year to maintain our various outgoings, and I see "Containers for Change" as a big part of this. So, if you have bottles and cans, please save them for us and get your family and friends behind this initiative, it will help us a lot throughout the year. If you have difficulty in getting the containers to a drop off point, please let one of the Committee know and we will arrange for them to be picked up.

Grants We have made a grant application through the Gambling Community for new computers, an A3 scanner and some additional funds for some Land Titles for Founding Families. So far this is looking promising but we will not know for several months if we have been successful.

City of Moreton Discretionary Fund We are putting in an application for new signage which we have now been given initial go ahead from the Village to put in a couple of places to raise visibility of the group. One may be placed on the AMRSQ building and hopefully one down and the start of the Village carpark. We are also going to approach Council to see if we are able to have a sign on the post at Beerburum Rd at the lights where you turn to go to the Village. There is a sign for CHV and I believe we should have a sign there too.

Projects

North Coast & Stanley District News – Digitisation - We are also looking at putting some information that we have spent a huge amount of time over the years acquiring, onto the website in a database format that would be a subscription format, user searches and pays for the information. The first lot of information would be the North Coast & Stanley District News. We have a way to digitise this information quite easily and need one of our members to volunteer take this digitisation project on. Full training would be given, and it would probably not take a huge amount of time to do. So, if anyone would be interested please contact one of the Committee. This has the potential to raise quite a bit of money for the Club on an ongoing basis once completed.

Founding Families - Our efforts in researching the many landowners in the Old Moreton Bay District has not gone unnoticed. Bribie Family History Assoc & Bribie Island Historical Society have approached us to see if we would like help with the project and following some discussions we have agreed to a collaboration. There has been a great deal of interest from these two groups in what and how we are doing this project and so we have agreed to a basic framework and a starting point for their groups if we can garner sufficient support.

Phingst Family Archive - We have been loaned a huge amount of documentation about this family which needs to be scanned for our archive. If there is anyone who would like to assist with this could you please let us know. It is going to be a rather large task, and any help would be greatly appreciated.

King St Cemetery Listing Details Update & Digitisation - We are working on updating all the King St Cemetery grave details and digitising these so that we have them in a spreadsheet that can be kept up to date. This information may then be made available on our website. Janet has kindly agreed to update the listing once it has been digitised. This will take a few weeks but should be able to begin shortly. Anyone interested in helping with this very worthwhile project please contact your committee.

Investigate Historical Sites Trail with signage and short story that leads back to our Club Rooms, if anyone is interested in helping to develop this idea, please contact the Committee.

Projects (cont)..

Digitisation of Old CFHRG Publications - We have several books that were published some time ago and we do not have any original files for them, so they need to be digitised and turned into MS Word files that we can use to update and republish if and when we need to. This is a fairly large project but needs to be done. If anyone would like to learn how to learn and then participate in this project, please contact one of the committee members.

Investigate Historical Sites Trail – We have had a thought about developing an idea for a trail around Caboolture highlighting the historic places and placing small signage/ plaques with a short story which then leads people back to CFHRG. If anyone has thoughts on how this might be developed and would like to take on this development process and perhaps help work out which historic sites should be included, please come and see us. This is just an idea at present but think it has potential to help our visibility within the community and highlight where many historic places were and are today.

Easter Closure – The Historical Village is closed over the Easter long weekend and therefore we will be closed on Friday 3rd April. We will reopen on Wednesday 8th April.

The Pittsworth – Herbert Pardey Collection of Glass Plates Negatives 1907 - 1917

Back in the 1980's, while visiting Pittsworth it was brought to the attention of a professional Brisbane photographer that there was a large collection of glass plate negatives stored there in a cow shed. When the first glass plate was lifted from the dirt floor of the cow shed, the excitement was overwhelming. With the light of a candle, the image of Britannia in her armour holding a trident could be seen and it immediately became evident they weren't dealing with an average collection of stereotyped portraits that were so common for the period.

The dry glass plates, which were originally thought to number around 700, gave away their age by the Edwardian fashions and the portraits of WW1 soldiers. The dates became more precise, being between 1907 and 1917. The photographer's name, Herbert John Pardey, however remained a mystery a little longer.

It is important to remember that Pardey's clientele was limited by the distance covered by his horse and cart. He photographed everything from weddings to funerals, community events to social life, and commercial to state contracts. Pittsworth, Queensland was his territory however the collection includes images that shows he travelled as far afield as Pratten, Warwick and Killarney.

Despite the fact the negatives had lain forgotten for decades, most were found to be in remarkable condition and in 2021 the mammoth project of cleaning and then digitizing the collection began. Recently the Queensland State Library started releasing the images to the public. These images are just a few of what is to be found in the collection, which has, after further research, expanded to well over 1000 images.

Help is needed, as sadly nearly all the photographs are unidentified. Any information that does come to light will be submitted to the State Library of Queensland so it can be recorded with the images for prosperity.

There are hundreds of beautiful images all over Pittsworth and surrounding districts. Maybe there could be some of your ancestors who passed through the area and maybe you might identify a family member. Most of these photographs have no identification and so any help that to put names to the faces and places would be greatly appreciated. Just a few select images to enjoy.

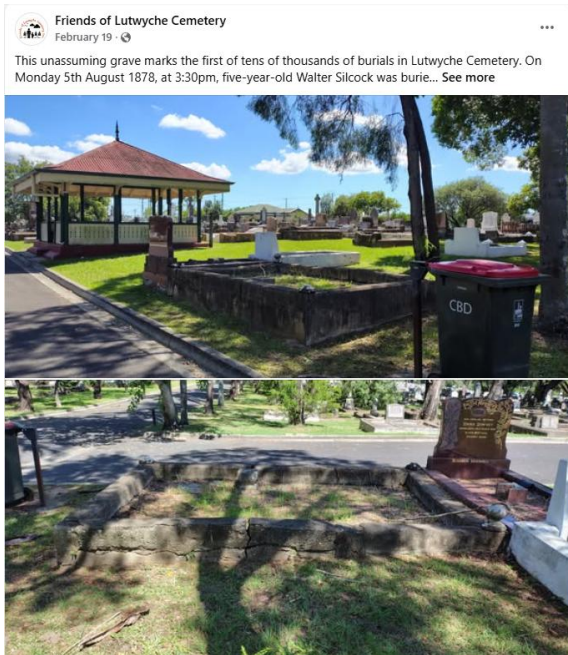

August and Maud (Mountford) Schrodtter rest in peaceful slumber at Nundah Historic Cemetery in location 7-4-61. Any headstone erected to their memory has long gone but they are not forgotten thanks to Phil and Helen Eaton and other Eaton family members, in particular Toni Eaton White.

Maud was born in Brisbane on 15 May 1873 to Emma Eaton and Harrington Mountford. Her mother, Emma, was the youngest child of William and Ann (Powell) Eaton. William and Ann and their children set sail from Liverpool bound for Australia in the October of 1857. Folk who live on Brisbane's northside would be familiar with the suburb of Eatons Hill and Eatons Crossing Road, and the Eaton family are primarily remembered as pioneer settlers and for their farming presence and public service in the South Pine and in the wider Woodford areas.

When Maud was a small child, her parents packed up and the family immigrated to California. It appears America was not what they expected and the family returned to Queensland, eventually settling at Stony Creek near Woodford.

In March 1899, Maud married August Ferdinand Schrodtter in Brisbane. August's father had emigrated from Germany in 1865 but had drowned during the December 1872 floods, five months before August's birth.

Following the wedding, August and Maud moved to a grazing property, Monsildale, just north of Sheep Station Creek (near Kilcoy). In 1907, the Schrodtters moved to another grazing property at Linville and by 1919, the family had relocated to a farm at Lawnton.

In the 1930s, August was diagnosed with a heart condition, so they retired to Eton Street, Nundah, with August doing the occasional odd job and gardening for others.

On 10 March 1941, August was on his way to do some gardening for a gentleman at Wooloowin. He was sitting at the platform at Nundah Railway Station smoking his pipe when he collapsed and could not be revived. He was buried the next day at Nundah Cemetery.

Maud remained at her Eton Street home along with two sons and their wives. Maud died on 25 February 1951 at 77 years of age and was buried with August.

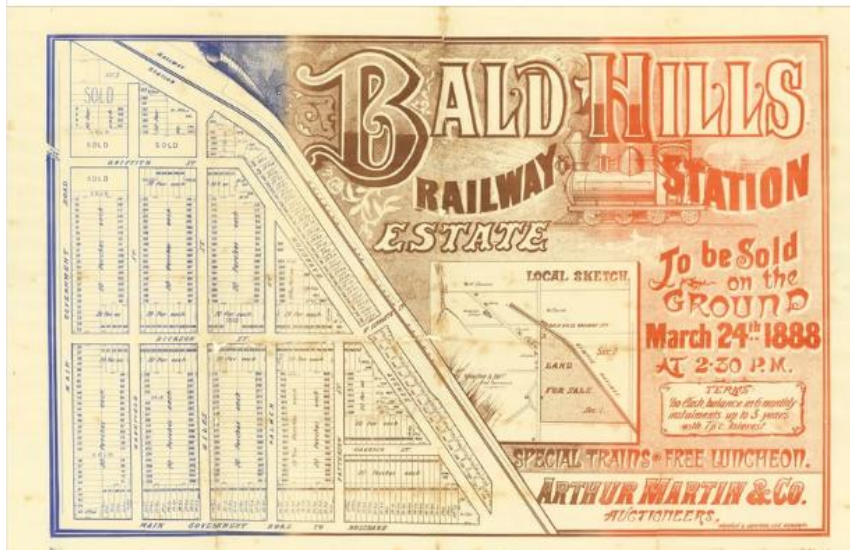

When the application for membership is accepted and ratified by the Management Committee, the applicant will be notified in writing and provided a membership card, name tag (to be worn at all times while in the Club Rooms), and a Starter Kit (containing a copy of By-Laws, Code of Conduct, general information about the Club, and family history research guides).
8. Refer to Association Rule 10 for conditions under which the Management Committee may terminate a member's membership.
9. A member must notify the Management Committee if the member is convicted of an indictable offence. (Refer Association Rule 10(3)).
10. Association Rule 13 requires that the Management Committee keep a Register of Members. Rule 13(2) specifies the information that the Register must contain for each member. The Register is open for inspection by members; however, Rule 13(5) describes circumstances under which the Management Committee may withhold information about a member. Rule 14 specifies when the use of information on the Register of Members is prohibited.
11. The association's Management Committee consists of President, Secretary, Treasurer and two other members elected at the Annual General Meeting each year. The Management Committee has the general control and management of the affairs, property and funds of the association.
12. The end date of the association's financial year is **30th April** each year. It is also the date for renewal of all memberships, except Honorary Life Memberships.
13. The days and times that the Research Library is open are advertised in the Club's Foyer.
